**Board Member Comments:** Trustee Aiello gave a shout out to teachers, parents and staff for doing an awesome job. Trustee Riordan agreed with her 100% and Trustee Lindelef said she appreciates the energy and flexibility of everyone.

Superintendent/High School Principal: Ms. McLaughlin said that the High School and Elementary have received helpful feedback from surveys that were sent out. She gave a reminder that we have entered the seamless summer program so all students receive free lunch with delivery being an option. Ms. McLaughlin informed us that the High School Ag department has launched a farm to table program, one crop at a time. They will be using the greenhouse for winter vegetables and will use the crops in the cafeteria for lunch.

Elementary Principal: Ms. Candelaria gave a shout out to teachers, maintenance, operations and staff doing special services and speech. She said that the survey that went out to elementary parents got great results. Ms. Candelaria said that both she and the elementary teachers have been in constant communication with parents. She said that they



sent out progress reports to students who were struggling. Ms. Candelaria informed us that the ELPAC testing has been pushed back again.

**PVTA:** Ms. Stoughton did a check in with teachers and it seems like things are going well. She said that there some staff members who are excited to come back to school and others who want to make sure it is safe. Ms. Stoughton said that she appreciates the flexibility of the aides to make sure distance learning is the best it can be.

**PVESPA:** Mr. Phillips gave a shout out to the scholarship committee, grounds, cafeteria, transportation and preschool for doing a good job in supporting everybody. He also said that they are in mediation. He hopes that the district will do the right thing and that they can come to an agreement soon.

ASB: The new student body president, Angel Mann, said that they have 90% participation in ASB voting. She said that distance learning is going a lot better this year than last year. Angel said that seniors have started their senior projects. They have met with Mr. Calvert to discuss their plans for the future and lay out goals that they want to meet this year.
