### 7. ORGANIZATION UPDATES

**Board Member Comments:** Trustee Riordan thanked teachers and students for their hard work and thanked Krista for her hard work on the budget. Trustee Lindelef agreed with Karen and was glad to hear that things are going well. Trustee Aiello agreed as well and said that from a parent perspective she is grateful for how well teachers are doing. She said that Nichole Stoughton has been phenomenal.

Superintendent/High School Principal: Ms. McLaughlin reported that distance learning was off to a strong start with high attendance the first week, even with connectivity issues. She said that the school has given out 10 T-Mobile hotspots which are helping, but only work where T-Mobile gets service. She is pleased with how engaged the students have been. She said they have had difficulties with Zoom security but she thinks they have fixed the issue. Ms. McLaughlin said that there are several families coming on campus to do their school work and use the Wi-Fi, those spaces are being cleaned regularly. She gave a huge thank you to teachers for finding the rhythm

and instructional aides for joining Zoom meetings and doing small group instruction. Ms. McLaughlin said that there are still no sports. There are CIF guidelines for conditioning, however air quality is a factor in that.

Elementary Principal: Ms. Candelaria said that enrollment is steady at 155 students. She agrees with Ms. McLaughlin about a strong start with distance learning. Ms. Candelaria said there has been great attendance and that it has taken parents a little while to get the rhythm but they have. There have been technical difficulties, such as Wi-Fi, so families are coming on campus to use the school's Wi-Fi.

PVTA: Ms. Stoughton said that the school year is off to a good start and kids are able to do a lot more on their own as the year goes on. Her highlight of the day is getting on Sea Saw and seeing the pictures and videos of her students' work. Ms. Stoughton said she really likes using Sea Saw and the students are able to easily use the program. She appreciates the flexibility she has been given to make things work. She would like to do a parent survey to see how they are feeling about distance learning and check in. Ms. Stoughton said that distance learning is going better than expected.
